Meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by **Josh Nicholson, Vice President**.

Motion to accept minutes: **Senator Tom Lanier**, seconded by **Senator Andrew Cruz**.

Paula Rogers, Treasurer, stated that the budget stands at \$12,911.59

Tahj Brown, Chief Justice of Traffic Court, stated that there were 2 names on the docket, both were granted.

Jessica Gandy, Chief Justice of Judicial Court, stated that Judicial Court was not held this week.

Carl Langford Jr., Club Coordinator, stated there was no club news.

Committee Reports as follows:

- **Academic Affairs, Neal Torley** – Members should attend the meeting next week at 5:30 in the meeting room.
- **Student Affairs, Tanner Newhouse** – 6 proposals: see new business.
- **External Affairs, Hannah Weathersby** – Tuesday, November 10, is the kick off for Relay for Life at 12pm. Volunteers should arrive no later than 11am for setup. Volunteers should speak with Hannah after the meeting.

In the president's report, **Kati Andrews, President**, made comments and provided information for the following:

- Top three ticket sales at the Fall Carnival were: 1st AET; 2nd Rural Studies; 3rd FACS.
- Senator absences from the meeting need to be excused within 24 hours prior to or 24 hours after the meeting. Senators accumulating 3 or more unexcused absences will be brought before the Censure Committee and could lose senatorship after a vote of the Senate. Senators have until next Wednesday to submit excuses from prior meetings they have missed up until this point. The excuse forms can be found on the SGA website. **Will Amick, Parliamentarian**, read Article Three, Section Three under the bylaws in the Constitution regarding Senator excuses. Old business is as follows:

- The minutes from the meeting of October 28th, Senator Andrew Cruz stated that the Miss Bon Bon application due date was changed to this Friday. Application forms can be turned into the Cultural Latina club officers or in the SGA office. There is to be only one application from each club.

New business is as follows:

- **Student Affairs**, Tanner Newhouse brought 6 new proposals to SGA.
 1. Lighting needs to be added in between the 100 – 200 buildings and between Lakeside housing and Town hall area. Motion passed with a majority vote.
 2. There needs to be an emergency call box at the parking lot by the soccer fields. Motion passed with a majority vote.
 3. Student ID cards should have a date system implied on them for safety reasons. **Izzy Greene** motioned to table discussion to the next meeting. Motion failed with a majority vote. Main motion failed with a majority vote.
- Recess was called at 6:40pm. Order was resumed at 6:48pm.
 4. There needs to be a painted cross walk between end of the 200 building and the south parking lot.
 5. Students who take part in a running activity at night time should be required to wear a safety vest.
 6. There needs to be a noise dampening material in Lakeside and Place housing to reduce noise of the washers and dryers.

Senator Will Gay, moved to adjourn the meeting. It was second by **Senator Tom Lanier**. The motion passed with a majority vote.
