SAILING TRIP

We offer our study abroad students an unforgettable journey to the Aegean island of Alonissos and the pristine National Marine Park. The additional fee for this four-day trip is \$900.

Note: Students participating in the sailing trip option must arrive on campus one day before the trip begins.

HOMESTAYS

Interns have the opportunity to stay in the homes of Greek AFS and Perrotis College graduates and their families. For a small additional fee (\$200), participants in the semester and summer programs can choose to spend one or more weekends in a homestay setting. Students doing a semester abroad can also choose to do a longer homestay over the Easter or Christmas holidays, for an additional fee of \$500. Homestays are offered on the basis of availability, and students must indicate their interest at the time they submit their application.

Visa fees are approximately US \$100, residence permit plus related fees (where applicable) are approximately € 170 (roughly US\$250)
