<sup>\*\*\*</sup>Most students choose to complete their internships during the summer between the junior and senior year, preserving a lighter final semester to complete the Senior Project. Students have the option of completing 3, 6, or 9 hour internships. Academic credit for a single internship is based on the scope of work and complexity of the internship and the hours worked under supervision of the internship director. Most students complete RSLT 4790, 3 hrs. credit, to meet the graduation requirement. Students may complete up to 3 such internships, RSLT 4790 A, B, C. Students must work in tandem with their advisor and the internship supervisor to determine the scope of work to merit more than 3 credit hours for any internship. Students who complete more than 3 credit hours for an internship will reduce the hours in General Electives by the same number of hours devoted to internships. No student may receive credit for more than 9 hours of internship credit in a program.
