When you report, ABAC will provide you with additional written information about your options including how to obtain supportive measures and pursue formal disciplinary and criminal investigations. You will also receive information on existing counseling, health, mental health, victim

advocacy, legal assistance, visa and immigration

assistance, student financial aid, and other services.

# WHAT STEPS CAN I TAKE?

If you are in a state of emergency, call 911.

You do not have to choose a course of action immediately, but consider preserving evidence should you pursue charges. Possible evidence might be letters, photos, emails, messages,

clothing, bedding, etc.

WHAT ARE MY RIGHTS IN DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS?

All College disciplinary proceedings involving

A complaint alleging sexual misconduct may be made by any member of the College Community. Once received, the Title IX Coordinator will determine which type of proceeding will be used for each complaint on a case-by-

case basis, taking into consideration criteria including the

nature of the reported incident, who is involved, and the

ABAC Police and or Title IX Coordinator

The standard of evidence in all College proceedings is the preponderance of the evidence. Upon completion of formal adjudication proceedings, affording due process rights to all parties, sanctions, up to and including suspension and expulsion, may be applied. All parties have the right to an advisor and a fair and impartial

process, the administration of which is the responsibility

shall be conducted promptly, fairly, and impartial from the initial investigation through resolution. Complaints will usually be resolved within 120 business days.

A formal complaint may be initiated by contacting the Title IX Coordinator. A complete copy of the rules for the appropriate process (student, faculty, staff, or visitor) will be provided to you at that time.
