 - **Teletherapy Sessions** (up to 3 30-minute sessions): To schedule teletherapy, use your ABAC email to [register](#) and log in. Choose a time that fits your schedule and select a therapist based on your preferences, including issue, gender, language, and ethnicity.
 - **988 Suicide & Crisis Line:** The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline provides free and confidential emotional support to people in suicidal crisis or emotional distress 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, across the United States. The 988 Lifeline is comprised of a national network of over 200 local crisis centers, combining local care and resources with national standards and best practices. - **Reporting Forms:**
 - Academic Dishonesty Report—Use this [form](#) to report academic misconduct. Incidents include, but are not limited to, giving or receiving unauthorized academic assistance, cheating, plagiarism, and falsifying results.
 - Hazing—Use this [form](#) to report all forms of hazing activities. Hazing is defined as any intentional, knowing, or reckless act committed by a person (whether individually or in concert with other persons) against another person or persons regardless of the willingness of such other person or persons to participate, that—(I) is committed in the course of an initiation into, an affiliation with, or the maintenance of membership in a student organization; and (II) causes or creates a risk, above the reasonable risk encountered in the course of participation in the institution of higher

education or the organization (such as the physical preparation necessary for participation in an athletic team), of physical or psychological injury including—(aa) whipping, beating, striking, electronic shocking, placing of a harmful substance on someone’s body, or similar activity; (bb) causing, coercing, or otherwise inducing sleep deprivation, exposure to the elements, confinement in a small space, extreme calisthenics, or other similar activity; (cc) causing, coercing, or otherwise inducing another person to consume food, liquid, alcohol, drugs, or other substances; (dd) causing, coercing, or otherwise inducing another person to perform sexual acts; (ee) any activity that places another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words or conduct; (ff) any activity against another person that includes a criminal violation of local, State, Tribal, or Federal law; and (gg) any activity that induces, causes, or requires another person to perform a duty or task that involves a criminal violation of local, State, Tribal, or Federal law.

- Incident Reporting Form—Use this [form](#) to report student non-academic misconduct. Incidents include, but are not limited to, alcohol/drug use, disruptive behavior, theft, and physical assault. Do not use this page to report events presenting an immediate threat to life or property. For immediate safety concerns, call ABAC Police at 229.391.5060 or 911.
- Sexual Misconduct/Title IX—ABAC strongly encourages members of the College community to report instances of sexual misconduct promptly (see attached). These policies and procedures are intended to ensure that all parties involved receive appropriate support and fair treatment and that allegations of sexual misconduct are handled in a prompt, thorough, and equitable manner. through year-round charitable fundraising. Most of the food is from donations. Products offered are dependent on their availability as well as our financial situation. We try to provide as much variety as possible while still maintaining cost limitations and providing for the basic needs for those who need assistance.


Community Resources/Services
